# **Cleburne Regional Airport hopes to meet north Texas pilots fuel and service needs**

**City believes new fuel service will bring new business to airport, and in turn help boost the city economy.**

***New Fuel Farm opens today.***

***Pilots can get AV Gas 24 hours on self-serve basis. New Jet Fuel service also available during business hours.***

CLEBURNE, Tx. - The Cleburne Regional Airport received government permission today to sell aviation gas and jet fuel at a new fuel farm built near the airport terminal.

Officials say the city plans on selling both fuels starting sometime tomorrow, July 9, once final calibrations are complete at the pump site and other computer equipment is installed.

Cleburne City Manger Chester Nolen and Airport Manager Sarah Herring believes this will help attract pilots passing through North Texas, or even based in North Texas, to fly into Cleburne for their fuel and service needs. Av Gas can be purchased on a self service basis, just like a person can fill up their car at a self service gas station. Jet fuel will be pumped by fuel personnel on a full service basis.

Nolen also believes the new fuel facility will also help attract pilots and companies to base their planes at the newly renamed Cleburne Regional Airport - Hazlewood Field, increasing business activity at the airport and in the entire community.
